ABOUT

Bravo Greater Des Moines envisions a community where arts, culture and heritage organizations across central Iowa are recognized and supported as vital contributors to the region's vibrant quality of life. The mission of Bravo Greater Des Moines is to provide reliable funding and support that strengthens arts, culture and heritage organizations serving Greater Des Moines.

Through a regionally collaborative model, Bravo offers financial support for arts and culture programs to eligible non-arts organizations through the Local Arts Program Grant. Organizations awarded this funding become Bravo's Cultural Partners.

The Local Arts Program Grant (LAPG) is funded through hotel-motel tax revenue received from local government partners that have current 28E agreements with Bravo, which includes Altoona, Ankeny, Carlisle, Bondurant, Clive, Des Moines, Grimes, Indianola, Johnston, Norwalk, Pleasant Hill, Polk City, Polk County, Urbandale, Waukee, West Des Moines, and Windsor Heights. Funding emphasis is on organizations located in and serving the residents of and visitors to, Bravo's 28E partner communities.

FUNDING ELIGIBILITY

An organization is eligible to apply for LAPG funding if it meets all of the following requirements:

- Is either exempt from tax under Section 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code, or any successor provision, and has a primary operational focus other than arts, culture, and/or heritage
 - OR -
 - is a primarily arts, culture, and/or heritage Fiscally Sponsored entity that has received three or more Bravo Cultural Enrichment Grants
 - OR -
 - is an agency, commission, council, or board of a government that does not incur direct expenses to operate an arts, culture or heritage-centric facility open to the public;
- Provides programming which, as a primary purpose, advances the enlightenment and entertainment of the public through the production, presentation, exhibition, advancement, or preservation of the arts, music, theater, dance, zoology, botany, science, natural history, or cultural history;
- Has a principal office within Greater Des Moines;
- Conducts the majority of its activities within Greater Des Moines, and principally benefits the residents of and visitors to, such area;
- When applicable, has a Board of Directors or Trustees comprised of independent persons; and
- Meets with Bravo staff prior to submitting an application. This is a requirement only for applicants not currently receiving Bravo funding.

Ineligible LAPG applicants, including those who meet the above criteria, are those deemed so by the Bravo Grantmaking Committee and:

- Hospitals and other organizations with a primary purpose of healthcare or medical treatment and political, religious or educational organizations;
- Those formed with the express purpose of fundraising on behalf of, supporting, and/or promoting applicants that are not otherwise eligible for funding (e.g. friends societies, etc. for medical, political, religious or educational organizations);

- Those seeking funding for arts and culture programs or capital-building; fundraising events or endowments; or existing obligations, debts, liabilities or costs that the organization has already incurred; and
- Those seeking funding for activities that are facilitated by external arts and culture programs or organizations (e.g. paying the cost of admission for, or transportation to, to another organization’s program);

The Local Arts Program Grant is a competitive grant process. Eligibility does not guarantee funding and all applicants may not receive an LAPG award. Specific eligibility requirement may be waived at Bravo’s discretion.

FUNDING REQUESTS

Cultural Partners may generally expect to see grant awards that are 30% or less of the program’s total budget, including direct and indirect costs, with a target of no more than \$10,000 being awarded to any single program. It is preferred that the funding request for any given program not exceed 5% of the organization’s total general operating budget. Eligible organizations may apply for funding for up to three programs per grant cycle.

Sunday, December 31, 2018

APPLICATION PROCESS

1. Review Application Guidelines

Ensure that your organization and program(s) are eligible for GC18 LAPG funding and will be able to meet all grantee requirements.

2. Create or Update an Applicant Profile

GC18 will be administered through Bravo’s online grants portal. Each applicant organization will be required to complete or update its profile in the system before beginning the application. 3. Meet with Bravo Staff

Applicants not currently receiving Bravo funding are required to meet with staff no later than Wednesday, September 20, 2017, to be eligible for funding and before submitting an application.

4. Complete the Online Application

Applicants will be able to save, revisit and edit work before submitting. A complete and electronically submitted application is required by all applicants. For your convenience, a fillable [PDF of application questions](#) can be found on the [Bravo website](#).

Applications that are incomplete, do not follow instructions, or contain inaccurate information, may be disqualified from Bravo funding consideration.

5. Upload Supplemental Material

Applicants will be required to provide supplemental material, which must be attached to an application before it is submitted. Failing to submit required supplemental material with your application may result in a disqualification from Bravo funding consideration. Required supplemental materials may include:

- Current fiscal year's budget
- List of program collaborators and partners
- List of program sponsors and contributors
- Federal tax-exempt status documentation
- Most recent IRS Form 990 - 501(c)s only

7. Submit Your Application

Once you are satisfied with your responses in the GC18 LAPG Application and you have uploaded the required supplemental material, please follow the instructions outlined in the Bravo Grants Portal FAQ for Applicants to ensure that you correctly submit your application. Upon submission, you will be able to print a copy of your responses for your records.

Late applications will not be accepted so applicants are strongly encouraged to submit their applications well-enough in advance of the application deadline to avoid technical concerns.

8. Confirmation

Immediately after submitting your application, you will receive an email confirming that your application was successfully submitted to Bravo. If you do not, please check your email junk folders, and double-check that you followed the steps outlined in the FAQ. REVIEW & AWARD PROCESS

All eligible applications will be evaluated by Bravo's Grantmaking Committee with final funding decisions made by the Bravo Board of Directors. Review criteria include the quality and merits of the applicant's program and other considerations.

Meetings of the Grantmaking Committee are not open to the public and applicants should not contact committee members or Bravo Board members directly to discuss applications.

Applicants awarded with a GC18 Local Arts Program Grant will be required to commit to the terms of the grant agreement, which must be signed by an authorized signatory of the awarded organization and submitted to Bravo no later than 3:00 p.m. on Friday, December 8, 2017.

Bravo Greater Des Moines is committed to a transparent, fair and consistent grantmaking process, and therefore does not consider appeals of final funding decisions as made by the Board of Directors.

Bravo Greater Des Moines reserves the right to deny funding or partially or fully withhold, defer, reduce, adjust or rescind awards to organizations that are not in good standing.

An organization that has been awarded Bravo funds is considered not in good standing if:

- The organization provides false or inaccurate information, or information that cannot be substantiated, in its application, supplemental materials, and or reports;
- The organization fails to submit progress or final reports on past funding by the stated deadline;
- The organization fails to sign and/or submit a grant agreement by the stated deadline;
- The organization fails to honor one or more of the terms stated in an executed grant agreement, including, but not limited to: expending all funds within the grant period or using funds as described in the awarded application; and/or
- The Bravo Grantmaking Committee designates it thus, with sound cause and reasoning.
